Subject: Supporting Children and Students Act, 2025

We are writing to inform you that, today, the government tabled the *Supporting Children and Students Act*, 2025 (the Act). If passed, this legislation would strengthen government oversight and accountability in public school boards and postsecondary education. The proposed changes would also increase the safety, well-being and academic and personal achievement of children and youth in care.

The Act includes proposed changes from the Ministry of Education (EDU), the Ministry of Children, Community and Social Services (MCCSS), and the Ministry of Colleges, Universities, Research Excellence and Security (MCURES).

For EDU, changes are proposed to the *Education Act* around the following two themes:

Increasing government's oversight of school board finances, governance and program performance; and

Promoting student success and enhancing student safety.

Accountability and Transparency:

EDU is proposing amendments to:

- Create a single, more nimble and flexible legislative authority to provide oversight up to and
 including supervision of school boards based on matters of public interest such as governance,
 finances, or program concerns;
- Provide ministerial authority to establish school board expense policies, including discretionary spending, setting out key principles and mandatory requirements for school boards inclusive of regulatory enforcement, disclosure and audit requirements;
- Allow the ministry to conduct school board audits, define the role of school board internal auditors and prescribe their duties and define the role of external auditors;
- Remove duplicative provisions for consultation related to regulations regarding provincial interest in education; and
- Establish ministerial oversight for school naming when school boards open a new school and/or change an existing school name.

Safety and Rights:

Amendments are proposed to:

- Require school boards to work with local police services to allow access to schools, permit them
 to participate in school programs and implement School Resource Officer (SRO) programs
 where they are offered by local police services; and
- Add regulation-making authority to allow the Lieutenant Governor in Council to set out minimum
 provincial standards on how school boards are to work with police, including authority to set out
 the circumstances within which school boards must provide local police services with access to
 schools or to permit them to participate in school programs, and governing SRO programs.

If passed, the proposed changes described above would come into force upon Royal Assent, with additional regulatory amendments and policy changes to follow after engagement with sector partners.

Other Policy Changes

Separate from the proposed legislation, EDU is planning for the following changes, if approved, to further improve student safety and support their future success:

- Standardize the requirement for police record checks by requiring school boards to collect, based on whether the person is in a position of trust or authority, either a Vulnerable Sector Check or Criminal Records and Judicial Matters Check every five years from employees, service providers, volunteers and students on an education placement;
- Allow school boards additional ways to organize the school day for elementary students to maximize student learning (such as the 'balanced day' model) through changes to Regulation 298;
- Incentivize student volunteerism by introducing a new Minister's Certificate of Recognition for Community Involvement for students who earn 50 or more community involvement hours; and
- Allow students to celebrate Ontario milestones by recognizing Ontario Day (June 1) annually in schools.
